## YOUTH MISSION TRIP

On Saturday, November 5, Dimitri and Aleco Psomas, Steven Kasperski, Anna Gross, Selena Holm, Reece Flynn along with Kidron and Cassie headed up to the Twin Cities for a day of service. We started at Shoe Away Hunger, Shoes are donated to them and they sort and sell them. The money is used for a food shelf at local colleges and a program similar to Rochester's Backpack program and other hunger concerns. They take all conditions of shoes as the non-saleable ones are sold to "Soles for Soles" to be repurposed. They will have their bus in Rochester on November 28. Adult shoes are \$5. Kids are \$2.50. Bring your shoes to the drop box in the Narthex to be donated by November 27. The youth will get them to the bus. From there it was lunch before heading to Arc



Value Village to sort and tag clothing. They youth did 3 "gaylords" in just over 2 hours!!! They let us go early!! We rocked it!!!



Our last project for the day was at Feed My Starving Children. We packed for Haiti. With Hurricane Matthew, there is a high demand there right now. During our session, 102 boxes for a total of 22,032 meals meaning 61 kids were fed for a year. Again, we ROCKED it as our table packed 40 of the 102 boxes!! We will be sending this years the Thanksgiving pie money to the Eagan Feed My Starving Children location to help pay for the meals we packed when we were there.

We were able to worship with former intern Caroline at her church in Harris on Sunday morning. She sends her greetings

to all.

Thank you to the congregation for supporting us in this work. The youth represent Our Saviors AMAZING well when we are in the community! Thank you for making this possible.

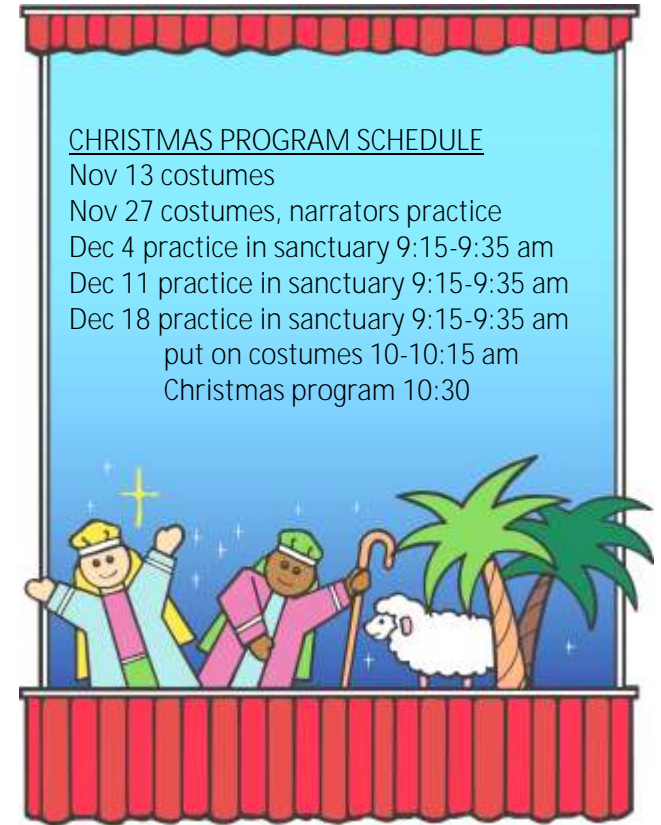
