But my dad had other ideas. He informed us that on Christmas Eve we were going to the soup kitchen to serve food.

This did *not* fit into *my* plan of how to celebrate Christmas. *I* wanted to go out to eat supper, then go to worship, **then go home to open presents...like we'd always done!**

But, despite my protestations, on Christmas Eve, before we went to worship we went to the soup kitchen to serve meals to the hungry and homeless.

...and it was one of the best Christmas' I've ever had.

I didn't get any awesome presents that year, I didn't get to go out to eat at our traditional Christmas Eve restaurant, and I even had to go to a different worship service than the one we'd “always” gone to. Instead, I got to serve people, and that made it an incredible Christmas.

Maybe you've been thinking about the ways you celebrate Christmas, too. This year, consider doing an act of service as part of your celebration. Perhaps you already do this, and that's wonderful if you do, but if not, why not try it out? You could volunteer to serve those who are hungry, you could cook a meal for a neighbor who's homebound, you could buy an animal for an impoverished family around the world from the ELCA's Good Gifts Catalog (www.elca.org/goodgifts).
